The Parliament of St. Maarten in its public meeting of November 9, 2018

CONSIDERING:

- 1. That violence and aggression undermine the social fabric of any nation;
- 2. That more and more it is being demonstrated that individuals seek solutions by means of aggressive acts;
- 3. That social media amplifies what is taking place and the resulting sensationalism surrounding any altercation only adds fire to fury;
- 4. That fights around our schools by students and others are perceived to be on the increase, possibly because of the same social media coverage;
- 5. That a process of re-education and tolerance is slow, but hopefully beneficial in the future;
- 6. The workshops organized by the Student Support Services Division (SSSD) of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Youth and Sports;
- 7. That the responses from the session of November 7, 2018 could be summarized in the following main topics:
 - 1) Schools should have more control and apply their rules.
 - 2) students should not be allowed to leave the school premises during the time they are supposed to be in class.
 - 3) students that video or live-stream school fights, should be held responsible by the law.
 - 4) Parents should limit kids time on Social media.
 - 5) kids must be forewarned about the consequences of their own actions.
 - 6) Government must urgently build a youth detention center.
 - 7) Radio personalities on radio shows to be reminded of the unbelievably huge

responsibility they have with their ability to influence young minds.

- 8) building more juvenile jails does not contribute to the sustainability of our country.
- 9) make parents responsible for the actions of their minor children.
- 10) Remind parents of their responsibilities.

RESOLVES:

Call on the Minister of MECYS to use the information coming out its session(s) to draft a safe school plan in close cooperation with all stakeholders (School boards, teachers, parents, students, law enforcement and other community leaders).

That this plan will include the elements of:

- a. Parental support
- b. Positive peer pressure
- c. Parental responsibility
- d. School safety plans
- e. A school transportation policy
- f. A rehabilitation program catered to the youth
- g. Public Awareness

And to present this plan to parliament within 60 days, with a first reporting on its progress in 30 days.
