Subject: Letter for Minister of Public Health, Social Development and Labor

Honorable President:

Via you Madame President I will like to address the following to the Minister of Public Health, Social Development and Labor, the Honorable Emil Lee.

It has been brought to my attention that the following hotels have been tested positive for legionella bacteria. Namely: Saphire, Alegreia and Tamarind hotel.

The St. Maarten Medical Center (SMMC) was also tested positive for legionella.

Based on the information received, in recent Princess Heights was tested positive for Ecoli and legionella bacteria.

With the aforementioned information at hand and since legionella bacteria causes legionellosis including a pneumonia-type illness called Legionnaires' disease and a mild flu-like illness called Pontiac fever.

- My query to you as Minister of Public Health is; can you kindly confirm the accuracy of aforementioned information?
- Moreover, is it not mandatory for all hotels to have a bacteria monitoring program in place?
