PARLIAMENT OF SINT MAARTEN

Draft Motion

The Parliament of Sint Maarten in its meeting of today, December 14th 2016;

Considering:

- The motion of the Parliament of St. Maarten dated September 17, 2015 regarding English as the first official and "mother tongue" language.
- That the government has declared that the plan to establish English as the first official language requires a considerable investment;
- That the aforementioned motion calls for a plan of approach, which shall include the following components;
 - Establishing English as the first and "mother tongue" language for Sint Maarten.
 - Gradual introduction of the use of the mother tongue as the first official language.
 - A plan for the civil service.
- That the draft budget 2017 for the country does not provide an allocation of funds to develop the plan of approach;
- That government's policy drafting capacity across the board is heavily taxed;
- That this initiative will strand if no concrete action is undertaken;

Resolves:

 To instruct the government of St. Maarten to allocate f 500.000 in the first budget amendment 2017, due by May 15 of the same year, to the development of the plan: English as the first official language of St. Maarten.
