Honorable Prime Minister Jacobs,


In recent days reports have come out regarding the 7<sup>th</sup> tranche of liquidity assistance for St. Maarten.

According to information attributed to State Secretary Knops and the BZK ministry, St. Maarten while not totally in compliance with all the set conditions will nevertheless receive the 7<sup>th</sup> tranche of the liquidity assistance from the Netherlands, which according to reports amounts to approximately 22 million guilders.

Assuming that this information is accurate, please provide answers to the following questions:

1. What are/were the conditions relating to the 7<sup>th</sup> tranche of liquidity assistance?
2. On the basis of what was the amount of approximately 22 million guilders calculated?
3. Did the CFT provide advice regarding the 7<sup>th</sup> tranche? If so, what was this advice?
4. Please provide an update of the financial position of the government of St. Maarten.
