Vision and Mission for the Ministry of Justice

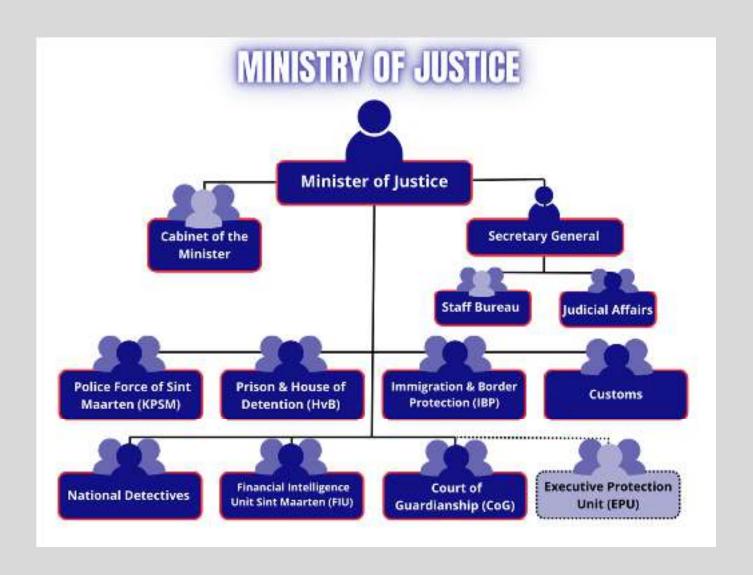
Vision

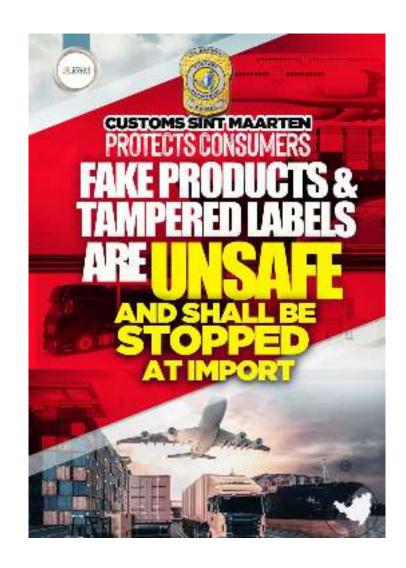

Hosted 1st Anti-Counterfeiting and Intellectual Property Conference on Sint Maarten

Pursuant to article 2:324 of the Criminal Code, he who intentionally imports, transits, exports, sells, offers for sale, delivers, distributes, or has counterfeit goods in stock, shall be punished with a term of imprisonment not exceeding one year or a fine of the third category (up to ANG 25000.00).

This allows the Ministry the ability to enforce already existent legislation.

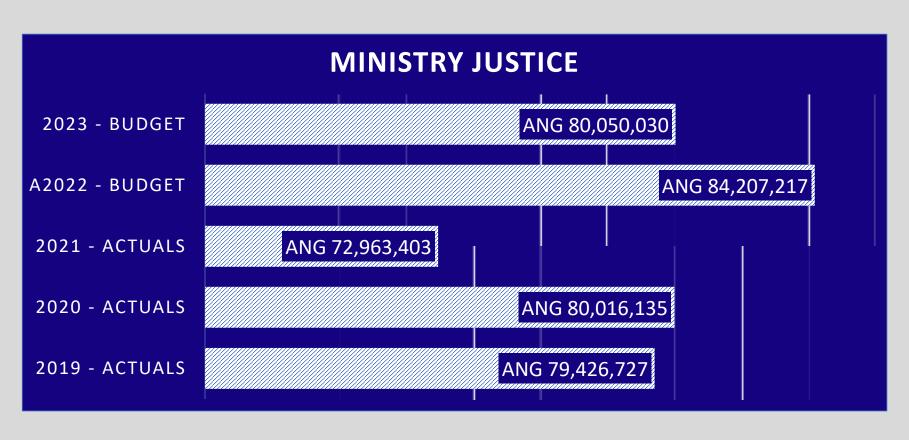

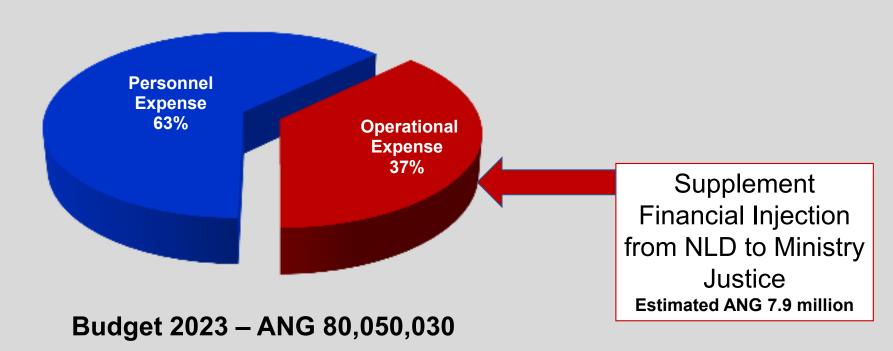


Overall Comparison Budget 2019-2023 Actuals versus Budgeted
